



## ALL CROPS ARE NOT CREATED EQUAL

Photographic prints come in many standard sizes. Although all images are created by the camera at a 2:3 ratio (just like a 4x6 print), many print sizes do not have a 2:3 ratio. Depending on the size of your final print, part of the image may be cropped.

## WHAT IS THE RIGHT SIZE?

There is no right or wrong answer. It is most important to be guided by the wall space that your prints will occupy, then select a size and ratio that meets your requirements.

## CROPPING HINTS

- Choose creative crops for emphasis. A long, narrow print will accentuate a stunning background. A square print can draw the viewer into emotion or action in your image.
- Allow a comfortable margin of background around the subjects. Don't crop too close.
- When cropping onto a person in a close-up, avoid cropping at a joint (knee, ankle, elbow, wrist).
